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
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## **MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

#### THE CHANGING FACE OF CORPUS

In the past 10 years, the facilities at Corpus Christi have had a serious upgrade in keeping with the modern ways students learn.

Large windows connect classrooms to the outside world, so students don't feel hemmed in; they are able to spill out onto grassed and shaded areas or comfortable seating pods. Students feel safe on the school grounds with different buildings connected by pathways and gardens, and security is assured whilst the school is planned to connect as a whole. The Mater Christi Centre, which includes the cafeteria, is where both students and teachers can meet as part of the learning process. There's also a stage there, an area which doubles as a useful venue for performances, meetings and celebrations. For the decoration of both the interiors and the outside of the building, architects used natural materials and brightly coloured artwork to help create a warm, comfortable and youthful atmosphere.

The Dean Road precinct has been transformed - a new double court gym with 11 classrooms, a Fitness Centre, and brand-new courts was the first project undertaken in this area. This followed the refurbishment of the

old gym into a Performing Arts Centre comprising two Dance studios and small performance spaces, with Music taking over the former James Nestor Auditorium. These spaces double as air-conditioned Examination rooms, ensuring students are now comfortable. In 2018, the purpose built 440 seat theatre is taking shape, a building in keeping with the modernisation of the facilities at Corpus. Plans are underway on the final project on Dean Road, the 25m Aquatic Centre, a project many years in the making.

Maintenance of current facilities goes hand in hand with new buildings. Refurbishments have included updates in each block area, a '21st century' Library, as well as facilities important to students, such as wifi and Apple TVs which provide online access across the entire school, new lockers which house books and uniforms, and top-class bathroom facilities. This is why we have carefully designed every detail in each of our buildings, with students' needs front and centre in our planning. We believe this will be an ongoing focus for the College.

This is a story best told through pictures which accompany this article. We welcome past students to tour the College, reminisce about good times past, and join us in celebrating our future.














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### SEMESTER ONE SNAPSHOT

### **SEMESTER ONE SNAPSHOT**

#### SPACE CAMP | USA

Held over the April school holidays, Space Camp 2018 was a fabulous educational experience for all that attended. Space Camp is the second largest research park in the United States and is located in Huntsville, Alabama where the nation's Space Program was born. Students were immersed in group and team building activities whilst on Space Camp, undergoing various astronaut training exercises and engineering challenges which culminated in an extended-duration simulated space mission – the highlight for many of the students.

The tour also included Washington D.C. and Orlando, Florida. The students visited various Smithsonian museums including: The Air and Space Museum, Natural History Museum, Holocaust Museum, the more recent Newseum, and the American Art Museum.

The Monument Night Tour of Washington took students to some of the city's most popular monuments and transported them back in time as they drove along the same streets the Presidents have travelled and heard historical tales and anecdotes about the city's fascinating history. The night tour included: World War II Memorial, Jefferson Memorial, FDR Memorial, Lincoln Memorial, Vietnam Veterans Memorial, Korean War Memorial, Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial.

Orlando was the final destination and home to the wonderful Kennedy Space Centre which houses the original Atlantis Shuttle. The students toured the mission control room, and enjoyed a lunch with returned Astronaut Don Thomas.





### DANCE TOUR | MELBOURNE

The 2018 Melbourne Dance Tour was a fantastic educational and cultural experience for all that attended. The students participated in dance workshops, gaining valuable skills that will assist them with their curriculum Dance studies.

On day one, the students worked with two professional dancers from Chunky Move dance company. They started with a contemporary dance class before being taught repertoire from Chunky Move's recent work 'Anti-gravity'.

The second day was spent at Dance Factory, a dance school that has been running for over 30 years and is well known for producing highly talented commercial dancers. The students participated in a warm up class, which helped develop strength, flexibility and endurance, followed by hip hop and jazz classes.

The third day was probably the most challenging for the students, as they worked with professional dancer and choreographer Daniel Jaber who facilitated the students through a process of collaboratively creating an original contemporary dance work.

After three full days of dancing, the students were relieved to have a break, explore the sights of Melbourne and catch some performances.

To finish the tour, students had one more day of dance workshops at The Space Dance & Arts Centre where they were taken through four different dance styles: hip hop, dancehall, Broadway jazz and commercial jazz.

#### INDONESIAN LANGUAGE TOUR | JAVA, INDONESIA

During the April school holidays, a combined group of 15 Corpus Christi College and Bunbury Catholic College students went on the annual Indonesia Language Tour.

During the three days in Yogyakarta students visited the Kraton (palace) of Sultan Hamengkubuwono X, and his ancestors' beautiful water palace, Taman Sari. They experienced the traditional Javanese arts of silver jewellery making, shadow puppets, batik and visited Borobudur, the breathtaking world-heritage Buddhist temple. On another day, they cycled through local villages, stopping to look at rice farming and cottage industries such as tempe and bitternut crackers, and playing some traditional games. Students also managed to fit in the obligatory visit to famous Jalan Malioboro and its mall, riding home on andongs (horse carts).

The students spent nine nights in Malang, staying with host families. Our sister school, Kosayu, had prepared an excellent program, including school lessons, learning Indonesian, bargaining in the local market, cooking and selling food, playing traditional gamelan instruments, making ceramic pots, playing basketball, visiting a kindergarten, and performing a Javanese dance for host families. Students also went to a high ropes course, visiting a huge waterfall, learned about bees at a honey making centre, and visited an innovative centre for poor and orphaned kids called "Kampung Kidz." The highlight of that visit was a "Wipeout" style competition in teams where we ended up ... quite wet.

It is hard to believe how much was packed into two short weeks, and yet it was a life-changing experience for our students.





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FRENCH LANGUAGE TOUR | REUNION ISLAND

On the final school day of Term 1, 15 eager students from Years 9-12 set off on a cultural immersion to La Réunion. The purpose of the tour was for the students to fully immerse themselves in French culture, living as French school students, eating the local cuisine and practicing French speaking skills at every occasion.

During the two weeks away, the students attended school at College La Salle Maison Blanche, our sister school, where they were provided with intensive French language classes. Students also participated in Sport and Drama classes as well as Geography and History lessons which allowed them to discover the culture of Réunion Island. They were in high demand to visit classes, speak to the French students and share aspects of Australian culture.

Each student was allocated a homestay, where they lived with a French student and their family. This experience allowed the Corpus students to wholeheartedly embrace what it is like to live on La Réunion and allowed them to experience the warm hospitality of people from Réunion Island, engage in local activities and devour the delicious local food.

Some of the amazing and beautiful highlights of the tour included hiking the lush green mountain and valley trails, visiting the Piton de La Fournaise (one of the most active volcanoes in the world), visiting the wild beaches of the deep South, and snorkelling in the beautiful lagoons of the Island. The group even survived a tropical hurricane which kept them locked in their homestay houses and away from school for over 24 hours!

Each student came home a better French speaker than when they left. The tour goal was to purchase something from the busy Saturday markets without the shopkeeper wishing us "bonne vacance" (have a good holiday) and most of them were able to achieve it!

### **PEOPLE OF CORPUS**

#### FILIPA CARVALHO | TEACHING STAFF



Filipa was appointed Head of Academic Excellence at Corpus Christi College in 2015. In this role she has been responsible for many innovations designed to enhance academic performance, including the introduction of student Personalised Learning Cards.

As her students will attest, Filipa is passionate about science, which is not surprising given her rich background in scientific disciplines. Her undergraduate degree was in molecular biology and genetics, and she went on to do a Masters of Forensic Science, her thesis is entitled; 'A molecular method for the detections of ingested host DNA in the larvae and pupae of the forensically important blowfly species: Calliphora Dubia'.

On completion of her Masters, Filipa worked with lead forensic entomologists at the UWA Centre for Forensic Science. The work, similar to FBI work in "body farms", focussed on the fly maggots and pupae from pigs – vital in determining the post mortem interval of a human body. Filipa has some fascinating inside stories of Perth's crime scene – but, ever the professional, she is unlikely to share them!

Following this interesting forensic work, Filipa shifted her focus to genetics and took a position at Royal Perth Hospital. Again she was at the cutting edge of her profession, working in HIV research sequencing the HIV genome. During this time of intense research, Filipa discovered a passion for teaching and decided to move into education, where she could combine her two passions. Her interest in her craft quickly led her to being at the cutting edge of the integration of technology into the classroom.

What is also fascinating about Filipa is her cultural background. Born in Australia, but moving back and forth to Portugal over the years, she is fluent in Portuguese. If Filipa's diverse and rich curriculum vitae doesn't convince, this surely does! A highly intelligent and adaptable personality, with a thirst for knowledge, she is an inspiration to her students and colleagues.



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#### YUN CHEN | SUPPORT STAFF (10+ YEARS)



Assistant Technical Manager Yun Chen is a long-serving staff member with a passion for ICT and education.

Yun was first engaged as an ICT contractor in 2006 before being employed full time in 2007. Starting off in a service desk role, he quickly became an

integral part of the team, helping staff, students and parents with their ICT issues. Ever the flexible operator, Yun soon began organising and setting up audio-visual equipment around the College both for everyday use and special events. Over the years, Yun's responsibilities evolved in line with the ever-changing needs of the College's digital learning environment: the first BYOD (bring your own device) MacBook rollout in 2008; fibre optic installation and iPad rollout in 2012; and the transition to a true 1-to-1 BYOD era with the data transfer capacity to match. His current role of Assistant Technical Manager involves overseeing day-to-day ICT services, as well as asset management.


### WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Upon returning to Perth, Brooke continues to develop her unique design philosophy. ### LIAM DOW-HALL | CLASS OF 2008

#### Liam Dow-Hall: In Search of the Ordinary

In September 2017, Liam Dow-Hall was a guest speaker at the biennial Asia Pacific Autism Conference (APAC), a prestigious event geared towards helping people on the spectrum realise their potential and achieve their very best. Liam presented his paper, 'In Search of the Ordinary' at the new International Convention Centre in Sydney to an audience of people from all around the world, including service providers, researchers and policy makers, and of course people on the spectrum and their families.

Liam has mild autism and mild cerebral palsy and has experienced the challenges facing autistic people firsthand. He explained, 'My paper was called "In Search of the Ordinary" because I have had to work really hard at achieving ordinary goals such as getting job and buying a house.'

After graduating from the College, Liam attained a Certificate III in Hospitality and a Certificate III in Financial Services from TAFE. He also raised thousands of dollars for the Freo Street Doctor – a feat which led to him being awarded the 2010 Premier's Award for Citizenship. Yet Liam still had considerable difficulties finding employment, applying for 350 positions in a two-year period.

It was RACWA that gave Liam a chance in 2012, taking him on as an Administrative Assistant. He explained, 'They researched autism and asked me what help I needed. They kept giving me more responsibility, but also found ways to work with my disabilities.' He now enjoys permanent part-time status at the company.

After sharing his experiences at APAC, audience members approached Liam to congratulate him, telling him he had given families hope and that he was an inspiration.
